Scouting is a worldwide, values based, co-educational Movement. It began in the United Kingdom in 1907 with an experimental camp on Brownsea Island, Dorset.

Today, there are well over 28 million Members in 216 countries and territories and the Movement is still growing. Two-thirds of the worlds Scouts live in developing countries.

The Aim of Scouting is to promote the development of young people in achieving their full physical, intellectual, social and spiritual potential, as individuals, as responsible citizens and members of their local, national and international communities.

The Method of achieving the Aim is through the provision of an enjoyable and attractive scheme of progressive training based on The Scout Promise and Law guided by adult leadership.

The Scouts, with the Guides, are unique amongst youth movements in having a Promise and a Law which Members willingly accept as a guide to the standards of conduct required of them.

The Group is part of the Odiham Scout District (some 600 members) which is, in turn, part of Hampshire Scout County (some 30 Districts) with our national Association Headquarters at Gilwell Park, Chingford, London E4 7QW.

You will be pleased to know that Scouting continues! Explorer Scouts (14 to 18 years) are organized on a District basis and the Scout Troop maintains strong links with the Explorer Scout Unit. There are plenty of opportunities for Scouts to be introduced to Explorer Scouting and the Unit visits the Troop from time to time for joint activities.

Network Scouting (18 to 25 years) is the senior Section of the Movement in the UK. Many are Leaders with troops, packs and colonies at the same time as working for the Queen's Scout Award, the highest award in Scouting.
